

GEORGIA RUN FOR THE FALLEN TO HONOR AND REMEMBER GEORGIA MILITARY SERVICE MEMBERS WHO DIED AS A RESULT OF SERVING DURING THE WAR ON TERROR.

Relay Team to Cover 164 Miles for Fallen Service Members in a Tribute Run from Milledgeville, GA to Ft. Benning's Global War on Terrorism Memorial

Georgia – Beginning in 2019 Honor and Remember Inc. established the Georgia Run for the Fallen to call attention to and honor the men and women who have recently died in military service to America. A team of more than 20 dedicated runners will embark on a 160 plus-mile journey to honor every Georgia service member who died as a result of serving during the War on Terror and in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom, Enduring Freedom and New Dawn.

Each marker of the route will be dedicated to designated Georgia heroes and their families. The run team will stop at each "Hero Marker" HM to give individual tribute to waiting Gold Star family members, friends and comrades. The goal of the event is to create a 160-mile memorial trail through Georgia.

Georgia "Run for the Fallen" will kick off on Friday morning, October 2, 2020 at 6:45 am at Georgia Veterans Memorial Cemetery in Milledgeville, Georgia, with a "start" ceremony for the three-day, 160 plus mile run through Baldwin County, Ivey, Wilkinson County, Twiggs County, Jeffersonville, Houston County, Warner Robins, Peach County, Ft Valley, Macon County, Montezuma, Schley County, Ellaville, Marion County, Buena Vista, Chattahoochee County, Cusseta, Muscogee County and Columbus to finish at the Global War on Terrorism Memorial at the Infantry Museum at Ft Benning, at 4 pm Sunday October 4th. Run for the Fallen – Jon Bellona, inspired after the death of his college roommate and friend 1LT Michael Cleary in Iraq, created a national run of remembrance. Beginning Flag Day, June 14, 2008, a dedicated team of runners ran across America from Fort Irwin, CA to Arlington National Cemetery, one mile for every member of the United States Army, Navy, Air Force, Coast Guard and Marines killed in Operation Iraqi Freedom. Each year since the run across America, runners from around the world have joined Run for the Fallen in remembering our fallen heroes.
